

ORDINANCE #289

AN ORDINANCE TO REPEAL AND AMEND 9-1-11 OF ORDINANCE NO. 184, CONCERNED WITH WATER RATES IN THE TOWN OF CREEDE, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 224, BEING A PRECEDING INCREASE IN SUCH RATES AND TO RAISE SAID WATER RATES TO CONSUMER.

WHEREAS, because it has been found and deemed necessary to increase rates for furnishing of water in the City of Creede, a Colorado Town, to cover increased costs of maintenance, service and similar costs:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Trustees of the City of Creede, a Colorado Town, in Mineral County, Colorado:

SECTION I: Ordinance No. 224 be and the same is hereby repealed, which ordinance was established for the sole purpose of establishing water rates as of the date of such ordinance and which rates are no longer feasible.

SECTION II: 9-1-11 of Ordinance No. 184 of the City of Creede, a Colorado Town, County of Mineral, State of Colorado, is hereby repealed and re-enacted to read as follows, to-wit:

9-1-11 WATER RULES: All water sold by the Town of Creede shall be sold at the following rates:


	Rates per month
All single family residences	\$ 10.75
Hotels, Motels & Schools	\$ 14.30
Trailer Courts and Multi-unit apartments (per unit or trailer)	\$ 10.75
All small businesses which use water in the business	\$ 14.30
Large Business	\$ 28.60
Industrial	\$ 82.50

Water rates for persons, entities or buildings not specifically covered herein shall be set by the Board of Trustees of the City of Creede, a Colorado Town, in conformity with the intent of the foregoing rates.

SECTION III: The above and foregoing repeal and re-enactment of said Section concerned with water rates shall be effective on or after the 1st day of January, 1993.

SECTION IV: Declaration of Special Emergency: The Board of Trustees hereby finds and declares that a special emergency exists requiring that this Ordinance take effect fourteen (14) days after the publication thereof, and that the same is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace and more particularly, the public health and safety. The reasons making this Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the Public health and safety are to increase revenue to maintain and prepare for future replacement of the water system.

INTRODUCED AND READ IN FULL, PASSED AND APPROVED upon Motion, Second, and unanimous vote at the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the City of Creede, a Colorado Town, held on the 7th day of December, 1992.
