REVIEW AGENDA

Trustee Powell moved and Trustee Zurn seconded to approve the agenda as presented. The vote was unanimous. Mayor Grossman declared the motion carried.

REPORTS AND PRESENTATIONS

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT

Public Works Director, Ben Davis, reported on the following items:

- -A program was being created to address cross-connection control (backflow prevention).
- -A request for a budget increase is being made to switch to a better wastewater treatment enzyme that will treat not only the plant but the sewer lines as well.
 - -Road repairs had been done at the Creede Childcare Center and the treatment plant.
 - -The fall shutdown of the park sprinklers & restrooms had begun.
- Uff-Da Trailer Park repairs required scheduling of an on-site locater, but he was available within the week and the repairs should be complete by the next meeting.

LOWER WILLOW CREEK RESTORATION COMPANY REPORT

Mayor Grossman reported that LWCRCo's Phase I was now complete aside from a few unfinished items. Additionally, the stream channel was cut through the entire property, which was not originally part of Phase I. The company had been rewarded a \$55,000 grant for soil to spread to encourage revegetation.

MAYOR GROSSMAN'S REPORT

Mayor Grossman reported on the following items:

- -He met with an emergency management team from the US Army Corps to discuss the flume. They sent an email with some ideas for repair, and asked that it be sent to the flume committee.
 - -He was interested in seeking nomination to the CML Executive Board.

- -He will be attending a CDOT meeting in Alamosa in October.
- -He asked that the board pass a "resolution of support" for the school bond 3A on the upcoming county ballot. Trustee Zurn moved and Trustee DeLonga seconded to approve the resolution and give staff administrative direction to draft it.* The vote was unanimous. Mayor Grossman declared the motion carried.

Birdsey Replat: Dooley explained that a replat process had been attempted about 10 years ago to replat the Birdsey property on Cliff Street, but that it most likely hadn't been carried out properly. He will do more research and report back at the October 15, 2013 Work Session.

Biernat Request: Members of the Biernat family and members of the Art Park were present to discuss the Biernat's request to use the park for additional restaurant seating. The Board asked the Biernats to make arrangements with the Arts Council and return if the park lease needed to be changed and approved.

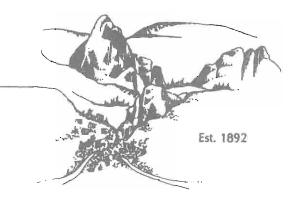

Other Supporting Information

What is the purpose for which this grant is being requested?

The money requested will be used to complete Phase One of the Lower Willow Creek Restoration Project. The Lower Willow Creek Floodplain is a 120 acre gateway to the City of Creede and the goal of this project is to restore the Lower Willow Creek Floodplain from its industrial heritage to a more natural condition. The Phase One work completes the construction of a new channel through the property and includes initial revegetation. Elements of this phase which have been completed include excavating a new channel course, grading the site to engineered specifications, installing rock vanes and other in-stream stabilization features. This work allows for the intense vegetation efforts of Phase Two to be possible by providing a growing medium for seeds, seedlings and trees.

What is your organization's mission statement?

The City of Creede, A Colorado Town's Mission Statement is "To provide and maintain infrastructure, facilities, community environment and services that ensure the health and safety, welfare and quality of life for both residents and visitors by balancing planning and freedom in order to maintain and continue the authentic, historic community that is Creede."

What are the specific outcomes your organization hopes to achieve with this grant and how will you measure the outcomes?

The overall goal of the Lower Willow Creek Restoration Project is to provide the community with a place for passive recreation. In 2008 the City of Creede sent out a survey to registered voters to ask what was the most desired use for the site. The majority response was that the site, upon completion of restoration activities, be used for passive recreation and open space. Specific outcomes of this broader goal include improving the physical, chemical, biological, and aesthetic qualities of the creek. To measure the success of the project outcomes, the project has a site specific Sampling and Analysis Plan (SAPP) to compare preproject conditions to post project conditions.

The City will use the grant funds, along with \$3,200.00 of City funds to make the final payment to the SLV Earthmovers, Inc., for the completed project work.

Who will be served by this grant?

The citizens of Creede will be served by this grant. Creede has transformed from a mining based economy to a tourism based economy, and relies on the natural beauty of the area to draw visitors for a few short months out of the year. Completion of this project will enhance the appeal of the Creede area to tourists while allowing citizens to tell a story about progress while respecting their mining roots. Other populations served by this grant include high school athletic activities, summer visitors and downstream users of the Rio Grande River.

What other entities (governmental or private) are providing support (if any)?

This project has garnered support from local, region and state levels, including the Willow Creek Reclamation Committee, Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, Colorado Division of Reclamation Mining and Safety, The Colorado Brownfields Foundation, the Colorado Water Conservation Board, the Rio Grande Water Conservation District, Mineral County, and many private citizens. Agencies mentioned contribute money and technical assistance, while most private citizens have provided their time and dedication.

What affiliations does your organization or members have with Hecla Mining Company (if any)?

The City of Creede is familiar with Hecla Mining Company's subsidiary, Rio Grande Silver, which has been conducting investigatory work in the Creede Mining District. The City of Creede is supportive of Rio Grande Silver's presence in our community and maintains a professional relationship with representatives of the company.

Lower Willow Creek Restoration Company – Administrative Direction

During the construction portion of the first phase of the Volunteer Clean-Up Plan there were some problems that resulted in more work being done than initially budgeted. The net result was Lower Willow Creek Restoration Company needing to seek additional funds of eighteen thousand one hundred sixteen dollars and seventy-one cents (\$18,116.71) for work completed by SLV Earth Movers, Inc.

The Lower Willow Creek Restoration Company is a partnership formed between the City of Creede and Creede Resources Inc.. Creede Resources Inc. has offered to put up fifteen thousand (\$15,000) dollars toward this obligation and we've been asked to come up with three thousand one hundred sixteen dollars & seventy-one cents (\$3,116.71).

I believe this is money well spent as it applies to the restoration of the Willow Creek Floodplain property below town as approved by the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment in December of 2011.

These funds are available in our Capital Improvement Fund as a result of postponing one of our 2013 projects. <u>I therefore recommend the Board of Trustees approve the expenditure of the three thousand one hundred sixteen dollars and seventy-one cents</u> (\$3,116.71) towards this obligation.

Annex of County roads- Administrative Direction

The attached letter to the Mineral County Commissioners is designed to initiate the annexation of the portions of roads not annexed when The Creede America Group annexed their property in 2006. With your approval of the letter and Eric's signature I'll deliver it to the commissioners.

Shop garage doors – Administrative Direction

The two garage doors on the maintenance shop have needed replaced for at least the last five years. The bent panels and twisted tracks make the doors difficult to open and close. The doors do not completely close resulting in lost heat during the winter.

The guys did some shopping around and the best deal in the valley is from Alcon Construction in Alamosa. As you can see from the attached we can get two doors with automatic openers for \$5,684.73. Again, these funds are available in our Capital Improvement Fund and I'm asking the Board of Trustees to approve this expense.

Brennand, Myers, and LaMee Properties – Administrative Direction

With the Boundary Line Agreement in hand we now need to approve a public hearing on December 3rd, 2013 for Ordinance No. 379 authorizing the vacation and transfer of portions of Cliff and Second Streets plus a fraction of the alley in Block 16, Creedmoor.

I'll then notify the adjacent property owners and publish notice of the public hearing no later than the 15th of November.

CIRSA Property Survey – FYI

We received the attached letter from Jay Williamson with our insurance carrier for our 2013 property survey. This is one of the better reports received since I've been here.

Nelson Tunnel Flow Measurements - FYI

Attached is a spreadsheet I use to keep track of the Nelson Tunnel flow. I use this for our annual augmentation water rights accounting report due the middle of November. As you can see in the "2013" column I asked the guys to monitor the flow on a monthly while Rio Grande Silver is dewatering.

Surface Transportation Board's Final Brief – FYI

The Surface Transportation Board and the United States of America filed their final brief with the U. S. Court of Appeals concerning the Creede Branch. This brief is in response to petitioners Eric Strohmeyer and James Riffin and their request for a Notice of Exemption (NOE) to use approximately seven miles of the Denver & Rio Grande Railway Historical Foundations rail line.

We've also received a copy of the Community Interveners' final brief in support of the STB's decision as well as the final brief of one of the applicants, Eric Strohmeyer. We may receive a final brief from the other applicant, James Riffin and I'll note for the record if we do. We don't expect the decision from the U. S. Court of Appeals until next spring.

If anyone would like to read any of the briefs please stop by the office.

Rio Grande Silver, Inc. Prehearing Statement – FYI

For the record I received a copy of Rio Grande Silver's proponent prehearing statement in the matter of revisions to the current temporary modifications and new site specific standards that allow for the deletion of current temporary modifications expiring on or before December 31, 2015.

They are proposing tiered site specific standards for Segments 4a and 7 of the Rio Grande River based on numeric expressions of current conditions. This proposal is expected to improve water quality dealing with cadmium, lead and zinc levels.

If anyone would like to read the entire statement, please stop by the office.

Headlee Replat – FYI

Tom Headlee's request in North Creede is moving forward as you can see from the attached note from Keith Luttrell. I hope to have the boundary line agreement ready for our December meeting.

Shane and Susan Birdsey property – FYI

Eric Heil is still working on the best plan to pick this project up. When we come up with a plan I'll add this to the Planning Commission's agenda.

Municipal Judge - FYI

Randi is going to contact Ruth Atchison to see if she will submit a more official letter of resignation for you to approve before moving forward with seeking another municipal judge or police magistrate.

Water tank property – FYI

I'm still waiting to get the revised survey from Keith Luttrell, Tom Malecek has moved to Alaska. When I get the survey I'll contact the temporary replacement for Tom to see what it will take to get the Small Tract Act started.

CIRSA Option – Work Session Discussion

We received some information from our insurance carrier this year on our insurance carriers Volunteer Accident Medical Plan. We've never used this, but every few years I like to discuss this at a work session to see if anyone has any new thoughts on it.

The Board of Trustees for the City of Greede would like to ask the Mineral County Commissioners to consider annexing the southern portion of Bea McClure Drive, the road directly north of the church property, and the road directly south of the church property into the town boundaries.

These portions of road were considered when the Creede America Group annexed their property into the town boundaries in 2006, but for various reasons were left out.

Bea McClure Drive extends from Bachelor road north to Silver Drive and runs along the east side of the church property. Approximately two-thirds of this road was annexed into the town leaving the southern portion in the county. The roads abutting the church property on the north and south ends were not annexed and also left in the county.

The road on the north end of the church property would be the extension of Helfin Lane as indicated on the final plat of the Creede America subdivision map. The road on the south end of the church property and west of Bea McClure Drive is Mineral counties Cemetery Road.

As the Creede America subdivision continues to develop we feel it would be in the best interests of the town, county, and community to annex these remaining portions.
